How To Apply

Students should visit the NAC&U Study Away web page - www.studyaway.org - where they will find a list of programs currently available. Students will apply directly with the host institution. The NAC&U website also includes a list of Study Away contacts according to institution. Students should feel free to contact these advisers with any questions prior to, during or after the application process.

Students pay tuition, room and board, and student fees at their home institutions. The student's home institution will be billed directly by the institution hosting the program. Credits earned during a semester away usually transfer back to the home institution, but students should check with their registrars or advisers.
